## **Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions**

### **S. 19 Licensing Act 2003**

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under this licence
  - a. At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of it or,
  - b. At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### **The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) (Amendment) Order 2014**

1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.  
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.  
(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.  
(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
  - (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
4. The responsible person must ensure that—
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;



- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

S19(4) of the Licensing Act 2003

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—  

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
 where—
    - (i) P is the permitted price,
    - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
    - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
  - (a) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
    - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
    - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
    - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
  - (b) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
  - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.  
 (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

**Annex 2 - Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule** – Varied: 30 December 2014

1. Electrical sockets used by entertainers shall be fitted with residual current device protection (complying with BS 7671 Requirements for Electrical Installations) and labelled accordingly.
2. The dance floor shall be clearly delineated and shall be positioned in such a way as to ensure the safety of persons using the dance floor.
3. The arrangements for access around the dance floor and for seating in the vicinity of the dance floor shall be such that neither dancers, nor others, seated or otherwise, are put at risk of injury.
4. Proof of age will be requested if any doubt of customer's age.
5. Seating shall be provided for the majority of customers.
6. No persons under the age of 16 to be in the area exclusively or primarily used for the sale and consumption of alcohol after 22.00 hours with the following exceptions:-

- The children of the Designated Premises Supervisor, manager or tenant and their bone fide guests.
  - In rooms being exclusively used for a pre-booked function.
7. Risk assessments in connection with the licensing objectives of crime and disorder and promoting the welfare of children will be carried out to the satisfaction of Nottinghamshire Police.
  8. A CCTV system with recording equipment shall be maintained at the premises and operated with cameras in positions agreed with the Police. All recordings used in conjunction with CCTV shall:
    - Be of evidential quality in all lighting conditions
    - Indicate the correct time and date
    - Be retained for a period of 31 consecutive days
 A member of staff trained to use the system shall be on duty at all times, as the recorded images must be available for inspection and downloading immediately upon request to officers of Responsible Authorities
  9. All images downloaded from the CCTV system must be provided in a format that can be viewed on readily available equipment without the need for specialist software.
  10. A Challenge 25 scheme shall operate at the premises. Any person who appears to be under 25 years of age shall not be served alcohol unless they produce an acceptable form of identification i.e. Passport, UK photographic driving licence, PASS accredited card or Military Identity Card.
  11. Challenge 25 notices will be displayed in prominent positions throughout the premises.
  12. Door supervisors shall be employed at the premises on occasions as deemed necessary by the Designated Premises Supervisor and/ or premises management following a risk assessment and on occasions when requested by, and following consultation with the Police.
  13. In the event of door supervisors being employed a bound book shall be kept and updated daily, containing the names, home addresses, dates of birth, SIA registration number and hours worked of door supervisors employed on any particular day. This book shall be kept at the premises for at least 12 months and shall be made available for inspection and copying by all Responsible Authorities immediately upon request.
  14. The DPS shall ensure that any door staff employed at the premises wear and clearly display their SIA registration badge at all times whilst on duty.
  15. All incidents of crime and disorder shall be reported to the police and a bound and sequentially paginated incident/ accident book shall be kept to record all instances of disorder, damage to property and personal injury at the premises. This book is to be made available for inspection and copying by the police and other officers of responsible authorities immediately upon request, and all such books to be retained at the premises' for at least 12 months.
  16. A bound and sequentially paginated refusals book or EPOS till records shall be kept at the premises to record all instances where admission or service is refused. Details to show:
    - The basis for the refusal
    - The person making the decision to refuse; and
    - The date and time of the refusal
 Such record to be retained at the premises for at least 12 months, and shall be made available for inspection and copying by the police, or other responsible authority, immediately upon request.
  17. The Designated Premises Supervisor must ensure that notices are displayed advising customers to leave in a quiet and orderly manner and be respectful of neighbours.
  18. The toilets at the premises to be checked at least weekly for drugs use and the evidence of supply taking place. Cocaine wipes to be used when carrying out the checks. Records of such checks are to be kept in a register which shall be retained at the premises for at least 12 months, and shall be made available for inspection and copying by the police immediately upon request.
  19. All bottles and glasses shall be removed from the public areas as soon as reasonably practicable when they are either finished with, or when empty.

20. The Designated Premises Supervisor will ensure that a company representative will attend meetings and support any voluntary partnership organisations aimed at reducing crime and disorder.
21. Training records will be kept in respect of every relevant member of staff. The areas of training to include:

- Preventing underage sales of alcohol
- Preventing proxy sales of alcohol to underage persons
- Preventing sales of alcohol to a person who is drunk

Such records shall be made available for inspection following a request by the police and other officers of a Responsible Authority, subject to compliance with the legislation in relation to data protection.

### **Embedded Restrictions**

#### S. 59, 60, 63 Licensing Act 1964

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

d. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 10.30 p.m.

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- (d) consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or, the taking, sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (e) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- (f) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- (g) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- (h) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- (i) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- (j) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
