Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions	
Door Supervisors	
1.	Only individuals licensed by the Security Industry Authority shall be used at the premises to undertake security activities, which include guarding against: - <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Unauthorised access or occupation (e.g. through door supervision), (b) Outbreaks of disorder, or (c) Damage, unless otherwise entitled by virtue of section 4 of the Private Security Industry Act 2001 to carry out such activities.
Supply of alcohol	
2.	No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence or, (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
3.	Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

4.
 - (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either –
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
 5.
 - (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price, which is less than the permitted price.
 - (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in (1) above–
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula–
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where –
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
 - (3) Where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
 - (4)
 - (a) Sub-paragraph (4)(b) applies where the permitted price given by paragraph (2)(b) on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (b) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
6.
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises –
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –

- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

7. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

8. The responsible person must ensure that –

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

For the purposes of conditions 6, 7 and 8 above, a responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

1. The above time restrictions in relation to the hours for the sale of alcohol do not prohibit:

- a. During the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises;
- b. During the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
- c. During the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption ancillary to the meals;
- d. Consumption of the alcohol on the premises by, or the taking or sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;

- e. The ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
 - f. The sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
 - g. The sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
 - h. The taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
 - i. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.
2. Effective lighting shall be maintained and operated on all external aspects of the premises.
 3. Management shall liaise with other licensees in the area regularly, with regards to the licensing objectives.
 4. Regular checks shall be made on the toilets and all areas where licensed activities take place.
 5. Where a drink is sold or supplied in a glass the glass shall be made out of toughened glass.
 6. The premises shall have dedicated glass collectors during busy periods.
 7. Glassware or bottles may not be removed from the premises save for any external area covered by the license.
 8. There shall be a health and safety policy in respect of the premises.
 9. Sufficient numbers and types of fire fighting equipment shall be installed at the premises and shall be maintained and serviced according to the manufacturer's instructions.
 10. Effective and sufficient internal emergency lighting shall be maintained and operated at the premises.
 11. Management shall monitor and control music levels.
 12. There shall be a policy in respect of smoking at the premises.
 13. Management and staff shall monitor and control customer departure.
 14. An air extraction system shall be maintained and operated in the kitchen and all bar areas of the premises.
 15. Management shall monitor customer entry times to ensure effective management of the premises
 16. A recognised proof of age policy, for example the Proof of Age Standards Scheme shall be implemented, maintained and enforced at the premises.
 17. Persons under the age of 18 shall not be allowed on the premises, at any time that the premises are open to the public, unless accompanied and supervised by a person over the age of 18.
 18. Persons under the age of 16 shall not be allowed to enter or remain on the premises after 2000
 19. No AWP machines to be permitted on the premises.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

1. Concerning the small outdoor drinking area to the rear of the property – in order to prevent potential nighttime public nuisance to nearby residential properties this shall not be used after 2300. In conjunction with this, no music shall be played outdoors, and signage to the external drinking area requests patrons to respect neighbours and not make excessive noise.
2. Music shall be kept to a satisfactory level at all times and regular noise assessments shall be undertaken to ensure that no disturbance takes place. Music levels shall be regularly monitored around the external perimeter to ensure that it is not audible at the nearest residential properties. In general it is only standard background music that shall be played in this premises.

3. Although there is a taxi rank within walking distance staff have a dedicated taxi company and offer a service to ensure taxis are called for customers to avoid excess customers walking from the premises past residential properties and causing potential disturbance.
4. Signage is on display at the premises to “respect local residents and leave quietly”.
5. All windows and doors to be kept close, except for the purposes of ingress and egress, during the playing of any live or amplified music to reduce noise emissions.
6. Staff are given training to ensure that they are knowledgeable in the methods for controlling and dealing within any problematic or rowdy customers. Close management control is maintained at all times over customer behaviour.
7. There is to be no disposal of bottles or waste into external receptacles between the hours of 2200 and 0800 to avoid disturbance to residents.
8. Both entry points to the building have lobbied entrances so as to reduce noise emissions.
9. A last entry time of 2300 is to be put into operation so as to manage customer entry and departure thereafter.
