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## Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence,  
or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his  
personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised  
by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. . (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff do not carry out,  
arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.  
  
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities,  
or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of  
alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or  
contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children –
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage,  
individuals to –
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or  
supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible  
person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to  
the public or to a group defined by particular characteristic (other than any promotion or  
discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as  
defined in section 159 f the Act);
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the  
purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
  - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting  
event, where that provision is dependent on -
    - (i) The outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
    - (ii) The likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
  - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity  
of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-  
social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

4. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
5. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. **With effect from 1<sup>st</sup> October 2010** (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.  
(2) This policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
7. **With effect from 1<sup>st</sup> October 2010** The responsible person shall ensure that -
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) is available to customers in the following measures-
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
8. All individuals who carry out security activities must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority (SIA)

## **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule**

The Licence holder shall conduct the premises in accordance with the operating schedule submitted as part of the application and attached hereto. Where any equipment or installation is required by that schedule it shall be maintained in such condition and be used so as to promote the licensing objective(s).

## **Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority**

Any misuse and vocals at the premises shall be so controlled as to be inaudible within any neighbouring residential accommodation after 23.00hrs.

The licensee shall ensure so far as practicable that all persons leasing the premises do so in such a manner that persons resident of the neighbouring are not unreasonably disturbed by noise or unruly or unsociable behaviour.

Keep doors and windows at the premises closed after 23.00hrs.

Prominent, clear and legible notices are displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave premises and the area quietly.

**a) General - all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 15)**

Following an assessment of the premises and its surrounding area the following is proposed:  
30 minute "drinking up" time will allow appropriate dispersal, use of lavatories etc  
In order to further the licensing objectives the licensee reserves the right to move the fire appliances, AWP machines, cigarette machines and or any other similar objects temporarily in a fixed location which may impact on the ability of individuals on the premises to use exits or escape routes without impediment.

**b) The prevention of crime and disorder**

Illumination is provided to the exterior areas of the pub  
All interior trading areas are visible to the staff from behind the bar servery  
A rota system is in place for checking of the toilets  
The staff monitor customer behaviour especially during busy periods  
Burglar alarm system in place, alarmed doors and windows  
Drug prevention measures are employed and signs displayed  
Drink drive posters on site.

**c) Public safety**

Health & Safety policy in place  
A first aid box is on site  
All fire and electrical appliances are checked annually  
There are current electrical and gas certificates in place  
Staff are trained in our disability policy and assistance is always available.

**d) The prevention of public nuisance**

All entrance doors have internal lobbies which reduces noise emission  
A noise survey is carried out regularly  
When required staff organise taxis to transport customers home.

**e) The protection of children from harm**

Unaccompanied children are not permitted on the premises and only then in the dining area and children's play area  
The outside area is completely enclosed  
Children are not permitted in the bar.
